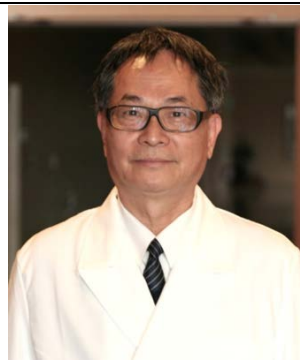

The cases of Integrated traditional Chinese and Western
medicine in the Intensive care unit
加護病房中西醫結合共照二個醫案分享

Abstract 摘要:

In recent years, patients with colorectal cancer have ranked second among the top ten cancers among men and women in Taiwan. Therefore, post-operative intestinal paralysis (POI) is a common clinical condition. Its symptoms are mostly abdominal distension, abdominal pain and discomfort, or inability to eat due to vomiting due to ingestion. Taichung Many such patients at the Colorectal Surgery Department of General Rong Group undergo traditional Chinese medicine consultation. The patient's inability to eat is due to functional intestinal paralysis rather than organic obstruction. Traditional Chinese medicine consultation often uses acupuncture, foot massage, and chewing gum as the main treatment methods, which are referred to as Zhongrongji. Intestinal three methods; its clinical idea mainly uses three different stimulations of traditional acupuncture, foot massage and chewing gum, through the input of sensory nerves and the stimulation of motor nerves to stimulate the reflexes of the spinal cord and brain to induce autonomic nervous response, thereby achieving increased Gastrointestinal motility effect.

The medical records of the two cases mentioned in this report are relatively complete. Both cases were intestinal paralysis caused by non-organic obstruction. The clinical results are quickly clear and provide reference.
